for the experience of the English merchants established here, and employ them to lay in our homeward cargoes, for if we do not do this we shall soon be obliged to abandon the trade altogether.

THURSDAY, JULY 12.

The universal anxiety which agitates all classes of people in this city for the fate of General Hamilton, renders it proper that we should state that at the time of putting this paper to press he was alive — Would to God we could add that there is room for the most distant hope of his recovery! — Alas! nature is fast sinking under the injury; and but a few hours more must close the scene forever.

It is probable the public will at a proper time, be presented with a correct statement of the causes that produced and the circumstances that attended this deplorable disaster.

This morning arrived from Falmouth, via Halifax, His Majesty's Packet the Earl of Spencer, capt. Coatsworth, with the Mail for the month of May. The latest London dates by her are to the 17th of that month, which are made to occupy most of this day's paper.

We stop the press to announce the melancholy tidings that GENERAL HAMILTON IS DEAD!

Capt. Don of the brig Mary, arrived in the river Mississippi, after a passage of 76 days from London, and 52 from Land's-End, gives the following account of the ill treatment he received from a French privateer.

"On the 1st of April I left the Downs, bound on a passage from London to New-Orleans. Nothing material occurred during the passage until the 21st of May, being then between Cape Tiberon (St. Domingo and Cape Maize,) Cuba. In the morning was brought too by a small schr. under French colours, which ordered me to hoist my boat out, and come on board with my papers; which I was obliged to do immediately. I had no sooner got on board, than the captain sent a banditti of extraordinary bad-looking men on board the brig; and

At Staten-Island, on Saturday, the 17th instant (aged 29 years and 3 months.) Mr. NATHANIEL SHAW CABLE, who arrived with his family 15 days before his death, from St. Thomas, where he had done business as a merchant upwards of seven years, with reputation and success, and came to this country for the benefit of his health. Mr. Cable was a native of Fairfield, in Connecticut, and has left a wife, a young child, his mother, two sisters, and a great number of relatives, and friends, to lament his death.

At Savannah, Georgia, on the 20th ult. Mr. JOHN BOGERT, son of Mr. Nicholas Bogert, of Beekmantown, Dutchess County, in this state; after an illness of one week.

With emotions that we have not a hand to inscribe, have we to announce the death of ALEXANDER HAMILTON. He was ruthlessly cut off in the 48th year of his age, in the full vigor of his faculties and in the midst of all his usefulness.

We have not the firmness to depict this melancholy, heart-rending event. Now—when death has extinguished all party animosity, the gloom that overspreads every countenance, the sympathy that pervades every bosom, bear irresistible testimony of the esteem and respect all maintained for him, of the love all bore him; and assure us that an impression has been made by his loss which no time can efface.

It becomes us not to enter into particulars; we have no doubt, that, in compliance with the universal anxiety of the inhabitants, a statement will soon be exhibited to them containing all the circumstances necessary to enable them to form a just opinion of this tragic scene. In the mean time we offer the following letter that we have received from the Reverend Bishop Moore. The testimony which this pious and venerable Clergyman bears to the virtues of the deceased, will we are sure not be lost on a discerning community.

As soon as our feelings will permit, we shall deem it a duty to present a sketch of the character of our ever-to-be-lamented patron and best friend.
