The following communication by Dr M. R. James, who was unable to be present through ill-health, was taken as read.

#### ON THE WALL PAINTINGS IN WILLINGHAM CHURCH.

The series of wall-paintings discovered during the recent restoration of Willingham Church does not, interesting as it is, call for a particularly long description. The paintings are for the most part easily decipherable—at least for those who have any experience at all in such matters: and they conform—save in one respect—to types already well known. This fact does not rob them of their value; it may rather help us towards determining their origin, in the future.

Before we study the pictures, however, we should, I think, express our lively appreciation of the very great amount of skill and pains which have been spent by the Rector, Mr Watkins, in laying them bare and in preserving and photographing them. He has set an example which other clergymen, to whom it may fall to make similar discoveries, cannot do better than follow.

The paintings which are to be described are all on the nave walls of the Church. We will look at these walls one by one, and take stock of what we find upon them.

I. East Wall. The Last Judgment, as usual, is found here. The figure of the Judge, of the Virgin and St John Baptist interceding and of the attendant angels with the instruments of the Passion have disappeared. The complete figure of an angel with a trumpet, and the arm of the other, remain. There remain, on either side of the crown of the chancel arch, figures rising from their graves: then on the spectator's left, the nude souls of the Blessed being ushered into Paradise by St Peter, while on the right, the Lost are hurried into the monstrous jaws of Hell. M. R. James, Litt.D., made the following Communications:

#### (1) On the Paintings formerly in the Choir at Peterborough.

Although there is no European country which has kept so many of its mediaeval institutions in working order as England, yet England is poorer than many of its neighbours in respect of the external fittings and accessories of those institutions. Our Cathedrals and Capitular bodies and our Universities exist, and are doing their work on the same lines at least as those which were laid down for them centuries ago; many of our ancient castles are still inhabited by the descendants of those who built them; and the country is still full of hospitals, almshouses and small establishments of the kind, some of which can trace their history back five or six hundred years. On the other hand, the Englishman returning from a visit to Amiens, Chartres, or Troyes, is apt to feel very keenly the poverty of his own country in such matters as painted glass, statues and bas-reliefs, ancient vestments and plate.

We all know how and why these splendours departed from us in the first instance, and we can appreciate the necessity of


ON THE SCULPTURES ON THE SOUTH PORTAL OF THE ABBEY CHURCH AT MALMESBURY.

The south portal of Malmesbury Abbey Church is a very famous monument of Ancient English sculpture. Over and over again has it been engraved, and a good deal has been written about the interpretation of the reliefs with which is is covered. I venture to come forward with a fresh interpretation of some of these subjects; and of course I do not doubt that mine is the only one possible. I am at any rate quite certain that my predecessors are wrong in several cases.

THE TAPESTRIES AT AIX-EN-PROVENCE AND AT LA CHAISE DIEU.

### 1. Aix-en-Provence.

All the guide-books make mention of certain tapestries which are preserved partly in the choir of the Cathedral, and partly in the Archbishop's palace, at Aix-en-Provence. The French guide-books and monographs (such as that of Jubainville) tell the same story of their origin. They were purchased, it is said, in Paris, in the year 1656, by a Canon of the Cathedral, named De Mimata, for the sum of 1200 crowns; they came from St Paul's Cathedral, and were sold by order of the Commonwealth authorities.

It is always interesting to trace portions of the furniture of our cathedrals which have made their way abroad; but our chances of doing this are few. Most of us know the great copper candlesticks in the church of St Bavon at Ghent, which were presented to St Paul's Cathedral by Henry VIII. Others have seen the Paschal candlestick of the thirteenth century at Milan, which is very probably of English make, and perhaps came from Durham. Many foreign treasuries preserve vestments of opus Anglicanum, some of which, very likely, were taken across the water at the Dissolution, though doubtless most were exported at the time of their manufacture. But the list of English church furniture now to be seen in continental churches is not a long one.

The existence, and reputed history, of the Aix tapestries were important factors in inducing me to visit the old capital of Provence two years ago, and on that occasion I was able to

### PREFATORY NOTE

In bringing to light the accompanying text from the Library of Trinity College, Dublin, I should like to express my cordial gratitude to the Provost and Fellows of that Society, who, in the year 1901, kindly sent the manuscript to our University Library for my use. The transcript here printed was made for me by Mr Alfred Rogers with his wonted skill and care. I have collated it with the original and trust that it may be found accurate in all essentials.

By way of preface I have collected such information as I could with regard to the convent to which the library belonged, the manuscript of the catalogue, its contents and arrangement, Friar John Erghome and his books, and the extant remains of the library. I have also compiled some notes on points of interest connected with the books catalogued.

#### A GRÆCO-LATIN LEXICON OF THE THIRTEENTH CENTURY

The lexicon of which I am to treat in these pages exists in a single manuscript, no. 9 of the Arundel collection in the Library of the College of Arms or Heralds' College in Queen Victoria street in London. The collection in question consists of some 54 volumes. Like the Arundel Mss. now in the British Museum, it was once the property of Thomas Earl of Arundel who died Earl of Norfolk in 1646. It came to its present possessors about the year 1678 by the gift of Henry Howard dake of Norfolk, grandson of Esel Thomas. The bulk of the Arundel mss. were given at the same time to the Royal Society, and most of them were transferred by that body to the British Museum in 1831.

Of those which were given to the College of Arms a brief catalogue will be found in the Oxford Catalogi wanuscriptorum Angliae et Iliberaiae (1697, 2, 1, 177) and a very good full descriptive catalogue of then, drawn up by Mr. W. Black, was privately printed in 1829, with a preface by Sir C. G. Young, the then Garter King of Arms.

I should like in this place to acknowledge the great kindness of those members of the College of Arms, especially Mr. Everand Green, Rouge Dragon, and Mr. G. Athill, Richmond Herald, who have at various times given me access to this and to other manuscripts in their possession.

The manuscript no. 9 is a small folio, in which two volumes have been bound together. The first of these is our Lexicon: the second is a copy of the Annals of Nacholas Trivet. No trace is discernible of the monastic provenance of either volume.



### OVIDIUS DE MIRABILIBUS MUNDI

In Guillim's Heraldry (ed. 1679 pt 1. p. 137) two lines of Latin verse are quoted from "a certain author" à propos of the habits of the Lion :

> Parcere prostratis scit nobilis ira leonis<sup>1</sup> Tu quoque fac simile quisquis dominaris in orbe.

Who is the author? The sentiment, at least, occurs in Ovid (Tristia III. v. 33):

> Quo quisquis maior, magis est placabilis irae, Et faciles motus mens generosa capit. Corpora magnanimo satis est prostrasse leoni, Pugna suum finem cum iacet hostis habet.

The expression finds a parallel in Lucan (vi. 487)

Has auidae tigres et nobilis ira leonum Ore fouent blando.

while Claudian (Laud. Stilic. 11. 20) has:

Obuia prosternas, prostrataque more leonum Despicias,

and Dracontius (Romulea v. 307) says:

imitare leones Quos feritas generosa iuuat; super arma tenentes

Ingruere, fremitusque dare procul ore cruento Nobilis ira solet; subjectis parcere gaudent.

Perhaps we are justified in assuming that Ovid and Lucan furnish a sufficient basis for the matter of the lines which stand as our text. Until further evidence of the fact is forthcoming we need not suppose that Dracontius, -whose poems, and especially those on secular subjects, had

### Libes of St. Walstan.

The object of this paper is to put before the Society a new Life of an obscure Norfolk saint, St. Walstan of Bawburgh,

A Latin Life of him has long been known. It will be found most conveniently in Horstman's edition of the Nova Legenda Anglie (Oxford, 1901, vol. ii., p. 412). The text will be reproduced here. Blomefield, in his account of Bawburgh (vol. i., p. 641, fol. ed.; vol. ii., p. 387, 8vo ed.), quotes a passage from Bale, which gives a touch of local lore; for the rest he is dependent on the Latin Life.

Outside these sources I know of no document which throws any light upon St. Walstan. He is figured on a few Norfolk screens, which are thus enumerated by Husenbeth in his *Emblems of Saints*:—

 At Burlingham St. Andrew: crowned, in royal attire, holding a scythe and styled opifer (helper—or possibly opifex, labourer).

### MANUSCRIPTS FROM ESSEX MONASTIC LIBRARIES.

By M. R. JAMES, O.M., Litt.D., F.B.A., F.S.A.

In the following pages I have put together such notices as I can collect of books from Essex religious houses now extant in various collections. I can hardly hope the list is exhaustive, but it does comprise the result of examination of most of the great collections in this country. In compiling it I have had recourse not only to my own notes, gathered at intervals during many years, but also to Dr. E. G. Millar, Deputy Keeper of MSS, at the British Museum, and to Mr. E. A. Lobel, Keeper of Western MSS, at the Bodleian Library; their valuable help I gratefully acknowledge.

The number of houses represented is not very large. Infinitely the most important is Waltham Abbey, which contributes a fairly early catalogue, as well as more extant volumes than any other house.





### THE ANLABY CHARTULARY.

BY M. R. JAMES, O.M., LITT.D., ETC., PROVOST OF ETON.

The following note on the history of the MS. in kindly contributed by the Rev. Canon Ollard.

The MS, and its case, described below, were preserved at Neswick Hall, Bainton, until 1932, when they were purchased by the Fitzwilliam Museum at Cambridge. Their connexion with Neswick was as follows. In 1613 Thomas Anlaby of Etton bought from Ralph Salvin his estate in Neswick and Bainton. A hundred years later the last male heir of the family, Matthew Anlaby, died, leaving five daughters co-heiresses. One of these daughters, Elizabeth, had married Thomas Eyres, a surgeon at Croydon; she bought the shares of her four sisters in 1714. Mr. Eyres left no son-only two daughters, co-heiresses. The elder, Esther, married Robert Grimston in 1741, who bought his sister-in-law's half of the property. On his death in 1756 the estate descended to his son Robert (1743-1790), and then to his grandson John (1775-1846), who died childless. Neswick then passed to the sons of John Grimston's eldest sister, Lucy, who had married in 1706 Sir Robert Wilmot, of Chaddesden, 3rd Bart. Their fifth son, John, ultimately succeeded to the Neswick estate and took the name and arms of Grimston. He was succeeded, on his death in 1879, by his eldest son, John Robert, who died childless in 1895. The property then passed to his daughter, Fanny, widow of Walter Francis Wrangham, who died in 1929 and was succeeded by her eldest son. By the frequent failure of the male line and the consequent passing of the estate through heiresses into other families, viz., Eyres, Grimston, Wilmot, and Wrangham, the link with the Anlabys had worn rather thin; but it was sufficiently strong in 1778 for the second Robert Grimston to name his second son Anlaby. Anlaby Grimston died in Corsica in 1795 at the age of 17, and with him the last formal recognition of the ancient family of Anlaby by their descendants perished. The Chartulary, however, remained at Neswick Hall until, chiefly by the good offices of the Provost of Eton, it passed to Cambridge, where its compiler liked to remember that he had "sojourned and learned" five hundred years before.


